Greetings – We're in the midst of Advent as you receive this newsletter. We're thinking about the imminent arrival of Emmanuel, which means "God with Us," into our lives.

Of course, God was with us before we started counting down to Christmas, and will be with us the day afterward, too. The promise of this season is that God loves us enough to be born into our messy world and to meet us where we are. That covenant continues into our everyday lives, even when the carols hush and the candles are blown out.

Yet this season is a time set aside: a time of waiting and anticipating. Not a passive sort of waiting, but an intentional, engaged and active preparation. During this time, we're expected to wake up, to focus, to pay attention. We're getting ready!


- We are invited to take care of ourselves with renewed compassion: make time for wellbeing in body, mind and spirit.
- We are asked to take stock of our intimate relationships and tend to them by letting go when necessary, renewing those in need of care, or simply being present to the ones we often overlook and take for granted.
- We are called to act as ethical partners both locally and globally: advocates and witnesses, healers and workers for social justice for all people. Maybe we cannot change the whole world, but we can choose one corner of it, and make a difference.
- We are charged with nurturing the sustainability of creation itself by seeking environmental justice. As above, find sustainable ways to enter into this care for our home, our planet.
- We are claimed as God's people: this is a time to kindle spiritual practices that allow space for our connection with Godself.

Through such preparation, we make ready ourselves, our relationships, and our world for the presence of God.

Admittedly, in an era marked by tension, conflict, violence, hunger, poverty, disease, war, and environmental emergencies, we pause to ask ... where IS God in all of this? In that question, and its answer, we circle back to the Advent story. It turns out that every year, we are reminded where God is: born among us into the mucky, messy reality of poverty and oppression. After all, we are shaped in God's image: and Godself remains among us and within us, loving us, loving all living creatures, loving this world.

From the Pastor Continued

In his mortal lifetime, Christ journeyed mostly on foot and met the world up close. He encountered humanity's diversity and potential through each child, man and woman he met along the way, touching and being touched by the gritty reality of his people. He ate in the homes of marginalized, poor, outcast and exiled people. He found respite among folks living on the edges of their communities. He healed those no one else would touch. He spoke with and for those that others didn't acknowledge. He empowered the least likely individuals. He connected people to each other. He resisted oppression and overturned social norms. He was killed by an unjust government. He returned to us, beyond death, bringing reconciliation, grace and hope.

Ultimately, to do all of this, Christ broke himself open. Thousands of years later, we – the church -- are the living, breathing body of God. So in this season, we do the work of breaking ourselves open, too, in preparation for Christ's arrival within our hearts and minds, and in our relationships to each other and the world. When the songs grow quiet, the dark gathers, and the winter cold draws closer, God will still be here. The Spirit is present in every creative response, every courageous act, every compassionate outreach that moves us toward healing and resilience. And Emmanuel – God with Us -- is present in every breath and heartbeat: in our being and becoming.

May the gifts of Advent be yours: hope, peace, joy and love. And may the ultimate gift, the grace of Godself moving in and among us in this world, be yours, too. Blessings!

MAKING A DIFFERENCE ... locally and internationally



On November 13th our congregation celebrated Ukama Sunday and our Zimbabwe partnership with guest Reverend Matuvhunye.



Meg Philips recently returned from her trip to the Honduras with **Honduras Hope.** This is what she had to say about her trip.

"The money donated by our church helped me to purchase a new Singer sewing machine and steam iron that will be used to make all the girls' uniform skirts for school. You can see the 32 yards of fabric in front! Bringing a heavy sewing machine from the U.S. would have been impossible, and there were a couple of stores in Yoro where I could purchase one new.

Students attending middle and high school are required to have a specific uniform. Honduras Hope takes the children shopping for uniforms, shoes, backpacks, and other school supplies. This year, instead of just purchasing the uniforms, the decision was made to purchase the material for skirts instead, then pay the sewing cooperative to make them. Buying fabric and paying the women to sew the skirts, the cooperative has a money-making project and the total cost is the same.

All the work Honduras Hope does is discussed and decided upon by the villagers, this time the Education Committee.

I'll try to have a small presentation ready to show in January.. Meanwhile, thanks again for supporting me in this mission."
