In this winter season, I'm just finding my balance ... on skis, that is. And in other ways, as my family makes connections and settles into our life in the Mt Washington Valley.

Like you, we came here, in part, because the people here are special. And this place draws us and holds onto us. We've been called here.

And yet, life is always in motion, and we're always responding, as individuals and a community, to new situations, aren't we? Isn't that true for all of us: finding balance and purpose in a changed landscape?

Of course, we're living through more than a simple new year. We're finding our way in a different world, addressing extreme domestic and international issues related to social and environmental justice: from healthcare and hunger to immigration and employment.

Many community members are also experiencing changes in personal situations. Relationships are shifting. Bodily and mental health and wellbeing may be different for ourselves or loved ones. Work and economics bring us closer or call us further away. Dear ones have died. Some folks must leave, while others return.

So many different challenges and opportunities affect our ability to be present and to participate as part of Jackson Community Church. It's a different time and place to live, work and play as a community of faith.

So what gives us the courage and conviction to keep going? What gives us strength and resilience?

If we try to imagine solving all the issues of this era, or even one of them, it may be too overwhelming. Such challenges can stop us in our tracks, cause us to throw up our hands, close our eyes, and stand still, immobilized.

So maybe finding our way into this new year and across this new terrain is something like a beginner's cross country ski lesson. My teacher this week urged me to find a position that kept my center of gravity low and responsive, not leaning too far forward or back. Bent knees, shoulders loose. Centered. Poles at the ready. Eyes forward. Relaxed.


I was coached to take it one stride at a time. Just one kick, one glide at a time.

As for downhill, I had permission to make a pie wedge with my skis, hunker down, create some balance and tension, and go down as slowly as necessary. I also learned to fall, and work my way back to center, and slowly pick myself up again. And yes, I can make it uphill.

I have much to learn, but I'm not as nervous as I was a week ago. I can enjoy the flats anyway, and even gentle slopes, and explore and stretch myself. I'm not frozen with fear, unwilling to take any risks, because I might fall and be embarrassed, or trapped, or hurt.

A budget is just a budget unless it's not......

People don't usually like to talk about budgets, especially church budgets. Why is that? Because it's often considered confidential? Because it's sometimes confusing? Because it doesn't make sense? Because it's boring?

Or is it because a church should be focusing on the work it does not how mush it costs to do that work? Exactly! What if a budget could do both?

During the search process the pastor search committee was introduced to the concept of a narrative budget. This is a budget which expresses in words what it is the organization is doing in the life of the community. Sure there are numbers involved but the emphasis is on what the church has and hopes to accomplish, or answers the question 'why does the church exist?' Over the next several months as Jackson Community Church discovers our 'why', we will also be evolving our budget into a narrative picture of how that 'why' is brought about through the financial support of that vision.

The first step, which you will see in the 2016 annual report's proposed 2017 budget, will be a revision of the budget structure we are accustomed to seeing. By grouping line items together in a focused structure, we will more easily be able to see how our 'why' is accomplished.

This revised structure doesn't help solve the problem of a deficit budget, which like 2016, we are facing in 2017. But it does help us realize the importance of the work and 'happenings' of our little church within our community. And with that realization, the excitement grows! Plan to be a part of that excitement!
