The church year is about to come to a close as we conclude with our Pentecost celebration and our Memorial Day remembrances at the end of May and make our way into June, July and August!


Liturgically, we now head into the period that in church language is called Ordinary Time that stretches all the way into November when Advent comes upon us again.

Ordinary Time takes us, as spiritual pilgrims/souls, on the journey through the ordinary days of the year, the seasons that have no major holiday (I.e. holy day) like Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter and/or Pentecost. Ordinary Time is characterized by its more typical and routine qualities. In our more mundane daily lives here in the Northeast, we order wood, stack it, change our car footwear from snow tires to regular tires, re-order our closets from winter to summer, etc. and prepare to enjoy the warmer weather in the out of doors. We enjoy one another's company, spend time together, and share experiences and cherished memories. In our church lectionary, we hear the tales of the more ordinary days of Jesus and his travels and experiences with his friends and loved ones, his conversations and wisdom, and hear the tales of all his comings and goings. For us, this is the time of year that offers us more time for storytelling and enjoying one another's company ~ both in our church stories and in our own daily lives!

Indeed, as we come to the end of our own church year, we prepare to paint our church experience with the colors and textures brought to us by our church's religious education teacher, Sher Loomis, as she moves into a new portion of her life with her husband and loved ones. On Sunday, June 12th, we are planning to celebrate her tenure with us as our church gathering kiddos bring their "12 Gifts of Birth" to our sanctuary to mark the travels they've made over the course of their year here in our church. As our kiddos understand their place in a world that offers a blessed way of being, we are offering them a vision of a future to pass such blessing along among all whom they encounter. We give thanks for the gifts that Sher Loomis has brought to us! But there is more. News and information on happenings around Zimbabwe



From Farai regarding the new church they are building in Chikanga ,

-"Nice to hear that you always think of us. Our building is progressing. Our target was to finish by the end of June. However there is a cash crisis and members can't access cash from the banks. The situation is bad and coupled with the drought. We pray God hears our prayers. Our political situation requires God."

Other News:

-The government will recruit 8500 nurses to increase the number of nurses in government healthcare facilities by about 50%. Most rural areas lack quality health care facilities, and are in great need of more clinics and hospitals.

- The government is selling live wildlife to competent breeders in order to protect wildlife from dire drought

YOU WILL LEARN TO:


- view falls as controllable

HAPPY JUNE DEAR FRIENDS FROM MISS SHER AND THE CHILDREN'S CHURCH

I am writing to you just a few days prior to Memorial Day and it is a perfect spring day! The gifts of God 's creation are evident in the beauty of the blue sky, the song of the birds, the flowers blooming, and the temperature feeling ahh so comfy! Today it is easy to see the blessings all around me!

These are the gifts we need to take time to notice more often in the midst of our busy lives.

Over the last month the children and I have been sharing in our weekly Messages from the Children's Church (at service time) some special prayers and readings that connect to the gifts within each child, each adult, and gifts that God has bestowed upon us from the gift of family, to the gift of service and community.

In our Rainbow Room classes we have been focusing on "The 12 Gifts of Birth" book by Charlene Costanzo. This book came into my life as a gift! The Conway library has a bin of free materials near their children's room. I have been blessed with books, cds, magazines, etc from this box that I have been able to use at the Montessori school where I teach and also at JCC. When I found this book over a year ago it was during the time my husband was ill and it gave me great comfort. I read some of the passages to you during service time last year but felt pulled to do more with it!

As I explored the author's website I found her to be an amazing woman of faith, of strong family values, and of inspiration! She is a cancer survivor having been diagnosed many years back. In her book series (which includes "The 12 Gifts of Healing" and "The 12 Gifts of Marriage") she found healing and support. I just found out that she is now facing double breast cancer surgery before Memorial Day. Please join in my prayers for full recovery for this special woman!

As I have been working both one on one with the children and in small groups I have encouraged us all to look at the everyday gifts God presents to us with greater appreciation and to share the gifts we feel have been bestowed upon us in both small and far reaching ways when we see the opportunities presented.

We have approached each of these gifts with a sense of discovery, delving into bible passages that connect with each gift, re-reading affirmations we have worked with over the past year and picking ones that resonate with each gift, talking about our own inner lights and gifts we feel we have been given, and designing art pieces to represent it all.

I am proud of the children for the work they have been doing, for the insights they have shown, and I am thankful for each and everyone of them more than I can say! I need to thank Church Education board members Janice Nichipor, Lisa White, and Barry Chisholm, as well as Moms Amanda Murphy and Allyn Roberts for offers of help with our painting projects.

The board has been wonderful in my final days here at JCC working with me to plan our Children's Church program/getting it into bulletin ready form, offering to do the coffee-hour (Miss Lisa leading it) on that day, being willing to help in any way (Mr. Barry), and some extra support for several hours from Miss Janice when it was time to redo the Rainbow Room classroom (starting to take down my personal items and reorganizing things belonging to the church) as well as offering lots of onging encouragement as I have been preparing for my departure. If you drove by church the eve of May 15th and saw a vehicle there until after 7:30 I hope you recognized it as mine, so no concern! I hope you all will be pleased with the way things are being left. I so want it to be a welcoming, enjoyable space for others to now put their energy into!

Christian Education.....

In the past few weeks I completed reorganizing not only the Rainbow Room classroom but I wanted to be sure our other classroom spaces and storage areas would be neat and welcoming as the church prepares for potential visiting Pastors, new members, and later for a new Church Education Coordinator. I have compiled a binder filled with my lesson plans and other related information covering the 2 plus school years and 2 summer programs I have been involved in. It is on the shelf in the Rainbow Room to give these potential new participants (and anyone else interested) a better idea of what we have been exploring in the Children's Church program.

It was delightful to see the children helping out Pastor Leslie on Mother's Day with the beautiful flower communion and this past Sunday helping her with the Holy Spirit celebration! Thank you Pastor Leslie for the many unique and special touches you have brought to our services that have in particular involved the children! Thank you for the part you will be leading in our Children's Sunday program also! Thanks to Miss Judy and to the choir for their parts and to our awesome admin. Joanne for all the work she does, including handling all my written info. these past few years and finding special bulletin covers for us!

On Memorial Day I know many families will be away involved in special holiday events in town or elsewhere. For those students who may attend that will be our last day for painting their art work and then on June 5 Miss Janice will assist me as we pull together all of the work accomplished, do our final touches, and as we have practice time, as well as time to create a 12 Gifts of Birth art wall in the Rainbow Room!

On Children's Sunday June 12 I do hope so much that many of you will attend in celebration of the wonderful children at the Jackson Community Church! I am very thankful to say my husband Brad will be there to support me on my last day, but I am needing to apologize to all for in order for him to attend he needs to have his phone on for any emergency calls from work. He will sit at the back and slip out as quietly and quickly as possible if need be, but I am sorry if that is a disturbance. So many of you have shown me sincere love, caring, support, and especially prayers during the time Brad was so ill and that means so much to us both! I wanted folks to see how well he is doing and for him to see the awesome work the children have been doing. Thanks so much for your understanding and for that support I/we have been given.

So my dear friends...it is time for me to close my final edition of Messages from the Children's Church with Miss Sher for the "Inside/Out"! It has been an honor to be your Church Education Coordinator. I know God has amazing things in store for this church! My prayers and love will continue to be going out to you all!

May great blessings surround you, may your summer be filled with many moments of noticing the gifts around us, celebrating special times with family and friends as we will be doing in the Loomis family, and enjoying what gifts God brings to this church as transformation flows!
