Arrival of March!

And now the question turns to this: How do we walk through these days of Lent? More specifically - how are you walking through this season of Lent?




MAKING A DIFFERENCE ... locally and internationally

WARM MARCH GREETINGS TO ALL FROM MISS SHER AND THE CHILDREN'S CHURCH!

Today as I am writing this it is a gray and icy day (Feb. 24), schools are closed, sand trucks are out, and it is a day for reflection. From my studio window I was watching a squirrel dart from tree to tree, feathery seeming bits of snow falling with each jump, and a quietness prevailing that almost felt like a soft blanket being tucked around me!

I am anxious for the coming of spring but today I am resting in that late winter solitude, knowing the green shoots will be showing soon and fresh new beginnings will reveal themselves! The children in the Rainbow Room/Children's Church program have been diving into reflection with our lessons and as they have begun to pick individual "gifts" to explore and present to you all in June! Our discussions and prayer times in class have shown me once again that we have such a caring and amazing group of children in our midst!

The first week of Feb. I was fortunate to have Quinn Haggerty at church who shared with the congregation the following quote: "Keep your thoughts positive because your thoughts become your words. Keep your words positive because your words become your behaviors. Keep your behaviors positive because your behaviors become your habits. Keep your habits positive because your habits become your values. Keep your values positive because your values become your destiny." -Gandhi Following his reading Quinn and I joined his Grandma and the rest of the congregation for Pastor Leslie's message that day as his buddies were all out on the slopes.

The next 2 Sundays it was great to have more friends present for our planned lessons delving into tales from St. Francis of Assi and about being an instrument for a blessing on Valentine's Day to stories involving humble spirits, kindness, and love last Sunday (the 21st). We focused on the ways Jesus showed us His gentle, loving, caring, kind, humble Spirit and how He encouraged His disciples (and all of us!) to be more that way. I brought my copper bowl for healing arts/spa sessions and shared about how Jesus washed the feet of His disciples while each of the children present received their own experience. The aroma of lavender and other essential oils filled the room as they wrote their thoughts/drew in their Faith Reflection Journals. This week (28th) we will be talking about what true success really means with the lesson "Nothing Fancy" and verses from II Corinthians and from Romans. The affirmation is "My success is measured in happiness and peace within."

Now for March! This month is filled with such celebration with the time changing on the 13th, Palm Sunday and the first day of spring on the 20th, and Easter on the 27th! Ski season and special wintry events our children have been involved in will be winding down and we will start our studies based on the book "The 12 Gifts of Birth" by Charlene Costanzo. Here are our plans as they stand now...

March 7: Children's Church Communion and the lesson about Harriet Tubman as we continue to play catch-up from our Feb. plans.

We will hear the story of "19 Dangerous Trips" and we will focus on making right choices/willpower. March 13: Today we will focus on the gift of STRENGTH with the lesson "God's Strength is Everlasting" with a key verse coming from Isaiah 40:31. We will be engaged in all kinds of special activities from songs, stories, games, and art on this theme. This is the "gift" Micah White has chosen to concentrate on for his Children's Sunday presentation.

March 20: We will go back to our Progressive Christianity curriculum this week and next as we celebrate Palm Sunday and Easter.

Today the children will hear the story of "Anna and the Donkey", scripture verses from Matthew, we will focus on what "Hosanna" means and how we can bring praise into our daily round! The affirmation we will focus on is "I find my true self when I put others first."

March 27: Happy Easter! Today we will celebrate with the 4 R's...Rebirth, Renewal, Reflection, and Ritual! Our activities will connect to our affirmation "My true self is ever new. I am eternal light, love, and joy!" We will share verses from I Corinthians and our story will be "Andre's New Day" and if the weather is good we may try an outdoor nature related closing circle!

As I have been writing this I can feel my senses whirling just thinking about the changes in the seasons, the hope and promise before us, the joy of celebrating together that which is wonderful/filled, amazing, and joyous...that is what I see when I look in the eyes of each of our children! Take a moment right now to reflect on all the blessings around us...take a breath, easy, in and out, and as you finish reading my words...feel the energy of your own heart beating, listen to sounds around you like the birds I am hearing now, immerse yourself in time soft and quiet solitude as winter moves on to the first breath of spring, feel that in your own shining spirit, breathe, be, blessings abound!

Book review by Steve Swenson COMPOSING A FURTHER LIFE: The Age of Active Wisdom

by Mary Catherine Bateson_(Vintage Books 2011)

This book was most informative and personally encouraging for a still healthy, active, eighty-two year old.

Using Erik Erikson's eight developmental life stages Bateson, now in her mid seventies, justifies adding an additional stage between Adulthood and Old Age based on the fact that people are living much longer. From her research, insights and wisdom she outlines the essential life tasks confronting those of us composing our further lives in order to maintain our integrity and self-worth. Though typically "retired" we are not totally "over the hill" and still have value.

Not only do we have time for introspection but time to explore new ventures and commitments. With wisdom and perspective from the past we can still contribute to future generations.

As our "elder identity" unfolds, Bateson says we need to adopt a healthy life style which includes staying active physically, mentally, socially and spiritually. I sense she would agree with Garrison Kieler's spin-off, "Be well, do good works and stay in touch."

I'm looking forward to reading some of Bateson's earlier writings including <u>COMPOSING A LIFE</u> and <u>WITH DAUGHTER'S EYE</u>. The latter is based on her recollections and reflections on her mother, Margaret Mead.


Tin Mountain First Season Auction and Dinner Saturday March 12, 2016 Fryeburg Academy Ada Wadsworth Arena
