

Join us on November 13 for Ukama Sunday where we celebrate the deep commitment of the United Church of Christ in Zimbabwe and the New Hampshire Conference, United Church of Christ to walk together in faith and to serve together in ministry among God's people.

We are fortunate to have the new pastor for Chikanga, Rev. Matuvhunye (mu-tah-ven-you.) leading the sermon that day.

With Thanksgiving around the corner, it's always nice to think of those less fortunate. The **Jackson Bartlett Food Pantry** is always in need of donations such as canned vegetables, canned fruit, canned soups, canned or boxed milk, canned beans, mac & cheese, dry cereal, canned meats, small jars of condiments, and small cans of coffee.



Items can be left in the basket in the narthex of the church.

The Mission committee will be sponsoring 2 children from the **Christmas Stocking Project** this season. Back then children would receive a stocking with handmade mittens, an orange, a toy and a piece of coal.

Now a needy family can request 3 needs and 3 wants for each child. It would be helpful to have all gifts wrapped, tagged and returned to the church by early December.

Hurricane Matthew wreaked havoc with many places in its path. Haiti, a country already struggling with the aftermath of multiple disasters over the years, suffered a direct hit yet again. Hurricane Matthew, the first Category 4 storm to strike Haiti since 1964, has caused extensive damage.

- -175,000 displaced people are living in 307 temporary shelters
- -546 deaths, 438 injuries and 128 missing people reported
- -806,000 people are at an extreme level of food insecurity
- -1,421 cholera cases are suspected
- -34 treatment centers for cholera were destroyed
