This month we experience the longest — but not the darkest — night of the year. Solstice arrives just before Christmas.

It's easy to be drawn to the lights of the world: to revel in both natural and manmade sources of illumination. By day, sunlight glints on falling snow and casts long purple shadows over new-laid ski tracks. By evening, windows are filled with faux candle flames. 

What is a Crèche? A Crèche is model or tableau representing the scene of Jesus Christ's birth, displayed in homes or public places at Christmas. In the Christian tradition, a **nativity scene** (also known as a **manger scene**, crib, **crèche**, or in Italian presepio or presepe) is the special exhibition, particularly during the Christmas season, of art objects representing the birth of Jesus.

Many of us have various names for it, and probably, just as many various traditions involving the manger scene. Also, many of us have multiple nativity scene's in our households. If you have one that you are willing to share with us, along with the story behind it, we would love to have it on display in the church for the month of December.
