Brothers & Sisters — As we enter Advent, and prepare ourselves for the annual celebration of the Messiah's arrival in the world, we fill the air with music. So I wonder, what is your playlist for the holidays?

What songs make you want to dance? Which ones keep you company during these busy winter days? Which ones catch in your throat? Which ones bring tears? Which ones do you repeat, so you can sing along — again and again — out loud? What gifts do such songs offer you?

Our sacred texts are full of songs. They've been handed down for over 2,000 years. Some are famous, like the words of Mary's song to God, called the Magnificat and honored in the classical Ave Maria. Or the echo of the angel's chorus to the shepherds. Yet others are not so familiar.

This season, we'll focus on four of those Biblical songs. We'll focus on solos sung by Mary and Elizabeth, plus those raised up by Zechariah and Simeon, and anthems sung by the heavenly host of angels. The valley's multi-church study group, using the guide *Light of the World* by Amy-Jill Levine, also focuses on scriptures that introduce us to these Biblical songs. We'll even hear their refrains during the annual Christmas Pageant as we re-tell the nativity story.

In these sacred songs, translated across languages and centuries, you'll hear themes of praise and surprise, awe and gratitude, as well as expectations for justice and change in the world. These songs are filled with dreams, but also tangible aspirations for a world that is transformed forever by holy Love's arrival.

Meanwhile, don't we all associate Christmas with our favorite Christmas tunes? The pop ones we sing at home or the traditional ones we use in worship? Oh, yes, this is a season for singing.


This month, we'll go out caroling to our neighbors: bringing music where it is most healing. We'll revel in the message of peace as interpreted by Dennis O'Neil and Davey Armstrong. Throughout December, we'll savor special music by gifted instrumentalists and vocalists. All month long, we'll we sing our favorite carols and loop through our winter playlist.

Perhaps the music styles have changed in 2,000 years. The instruments that shape the notes are different. Yet if we listen to our favorite contemporary Christmas songs — not silly and sweet songs about Santa, sleighs and snow — but ones that reach down deep, we'll hear the echoes of ancient lyrics. We'll find them offering messages of awe and thanksgiving, resilience and healing, transformation and renewal.

May the songs of Christmas fill your hearts with hope, peace, joy and love.
