The dream of the Earth


Who chose us to emerge

### THIRD ANNUAL WALK TO END ALZHEIMER'S




This year's walk will be on September 14th in York, Maine. The walk will start at the York Beach Ball Field, Railroad Ave, York Beach, Maine.

- Snacks for parents to pack into kids lunches (granola bars etc)




### **Emergency 911 House Signs Available**
