Friends — Every morning you can listen to the local radio station and get the day's weather report. On the best mornings, it's rated a "fifty cent day." That the gold-standard — perfect conditions in any season — that originated with Joe Dodge's weather reports from the AMC (Appalachian Mountain Club) lodge up in the Notch.

Of course, written weather advisories are also available at the summit from Mt Washington's Observatory. The research station collects data and makes

reports for the education, enjoyment and safety of travelers, trekkers and outdoor enthusiasts at higher elevations.

Winter is fierce and fun around here. Dangerous and delightful. Cold and cozy. Bonebreaking and beautiful.

Of course, people used to see the presence of God in the extremes of weather: thunder, lighting, floods, drought, storms. And yes, in snowfall. In the Psalms, the poet wrote, "G-d sends out his command to the earth... He gives snow like wool ... scatters frost like ashes ... who can stand before his cold?"

Yes, when asked, most people claim to experience the presence of God in the outdoor cathedral of the valley and mountains that surround us! It's often why we chose to live in this part of the world.

Note also, that in times of winter, Proverbs advises, "She opens her hand to the poor, and reaches out her hands to the needy. She is not afraid for her household when it snows, for all her household are clothed in crimson." Ancient texts talk about being ready for whatever the weather may bring, and also of ensuring that more vulnerable members of our community are also protected!

What is our church doing during this winter? We are both playing in the winter, and helping our neighbors in tangible ways.

Part of our responsibility is to delight in the winter. To praise God's creation by reveling in it and caring for it. Many church members belong to school or extracurricular ski and winter sport teams, so they're training and competing. Others teach or patrol. Others educate us about winter creatures, science and environs. Many adults and youth work in the ski and hospitality industry: they're busy until the thaws come in the spring! We offer blessings for skiers on Sundays. Our church organizes community soup & ski events in partnership with the Jackson XC Ski Center; we also attend Tin Mountain Conservation events and outings! We host out-of-town youth groups who come to learn, play and serve in our community during the winter.

Volunteers sometimes winterize homes when emergencies arise. Other volunteers work with the local homeless/housing-insecure population — elders, families and young adults — to help them connect them with services and remain as safe as possible through winter extremes when they don't have permanent housing solutions. The church, as part of a network of the valley's faith communities and non-profits, responds case by case to assist our neighbors achieve safe transportation, housing stabilization, obtain heat and food and other basics.

Most days, people check the local forecast. Adapt plans accordingly. Prepare vehicles, shelters and gear in anticipation of possible extremes.

Sometimes the forecast is welcome; other times folks quietly curse whatever's coming next. After all, the winter's changeable weather provides jobs and invigorates our economy. It can also make life tougher in our coming and going.

With every footstep, residents and visitors tread intentionally, thoughtfully. Anticipate fun. Pray for sure and steady footing: no ice in the wrong place. And hope to arrive safely without dangerous falls.

Oh, yes, and our building is the weekly site of popular avalanche preparedness classes this time of the year! These are courses taught by experienced professionals for back-country skiers and hikers and outdoorspeople, as well as volunteer rescue teams. The workshops educate people about risks and responses in avalanche conditions.

This January, what does a "fifty cent day" look like to you? Is it perfect weather? The presence of cherished people? The chance to participate in a favorite pastime or engage in a particular passion? How do your spiritual practices, along with other aspects of your self-care, help you respond to your own 'internal' weather inside (mood, emotions, psychological outlook, mental perspective) as well as the presence of external elements?

May this year bring you the gift of days. Perhaps they won't be perfect. Yet may they be memorable and meaningful!

Donations for the Bartlett / Jackson Food Pantry are **always** welcome. There is a basket in the narthex for items.


