Friends & Neighbors, Brothers & Sisters — We deeply appreciate how each of you creates part of our beloved community in this corner of the world. In this holiday newsletter that encompasses Thanksgiving through Christmas and New Year's, let Love's blessings flow.

For instance, during the week of Thanksgiving, remember the ancient tradition of the empty chair, the additional cup, or the extra place-setting at the table. In this extreme example of holiday hospitality, practiced in many traditions, celebrants leave space for strangers. The idea is that we might, unknowingly, entertain angels or prophets, or hang out with the Messiah himself, though we do not realize it.

Isn't it a wonderful notion to treat all other people as potential messengers from heaven? How would you approach someone, if you truly anticipated such a holy identity?

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus' followers asked, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?" He replied, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

During this annual holiday, we retell the stories about how Jesus arrives bundled in swaddling clothes, and wrapped up in need. He comes into the world: tiny, infant, mortal, hungry, messy, helpless. Born in such a way, he immediately establishes love and intimacy with those who meet him, because he is vulnerable, too.

Jesus is also known, from the beginning, as *Emmanuel: God Among Us.* Indeed, his journey of embodied Love is quite human. Ultimately, his mortal journey models for us how Holy Love, which arrives as a child, grows up to serve humanity and honor creation. His life becomes a revolutionary Way of immersing ourselves in this messed-up and amazing world.


Friends, find the Christ-light in someone else this season. Meanwhile, let others discover that light in you! During Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas and into the New Year, this faith community and other organizations offer you chances to celebrate, study, sing, and serve together. They include so many ideas! Carole for our community. Attend the church's peace concert. Decorate the church for the holiday. Listen to stories about the arrival of Love. Experience Scrooge in a new way. Notice the people who help you when you run errands or do chores. Give to a cause you care about. Tackle food insecurity. Support a local family. Send notes and letters, photos and messages. Call someone. Pass the light!

What would rekindle your inner light? We also suggest ways for you to receive and be renewed by the gifts of the season. Light Advent candles. Explore the daily devotional. Read light-hearted books. Seek out good news. Sing Christmas songs. Write poems or journal entries. Open Christmas cards. Gather with friends. Pray in a new way. Renew your mindfulness practices. Worship with your community. Wonder aloud. Walk in the twinkling winter evenings. Wish for snow. Rest when you can. Sip cider. Smile.

## The Way Station

As old man winter bears down on us it seems it is a good reminder as we step into warm houses and huddle around woodstoves that not everyone has this luxury. The number of homeless folks has risen in the Mount Washington Valley over the years. The Way Station was started as a day resource center to serve the homeless population, giving them a place to shower, do laundry, and get some necessary supplies.



If you have an extra tent, sleeping bag, or camp stove it would be put to good use by these folks. They can always use some canned food—particularly those with pop-tops, such as beef stew, spaghettios, etc. and of course, peanut butter is always a great staple. These items can be dropped off in the Narthex of the church and will be transported over to the Way Station.

# **Bartlett Jackson Food Pantry**



The Jackson Bartlett Food Pantry has changed their hours and are now open the first and third Saturday of every month from 10-12pm. Most non perishable items will be welcomed with these items in particular demand right now: Ketchup, mayonnaise, baked beans, crackers, spaghetti sauce, tuna fish, snacks, toilet paper and paper towels. These items can be dropped off in the wicker basket in the narthex of the church.

Honduras Hope is a New Hampshire based non-profit supporting health, education and entrepreneurship in rural Honduras.

Prior to the pandemic Honduras Hope volunteers travelled to their sister communities of Plan Grande, San Jose de Machigua and Yoro four times per year. Even though the in-person program is temporarily on

hold they are working closely together with their in-country coordinator to manage programs and projects. The most current Fall 2021 Newsletter (click) gives us a overview of the recent progress being made.

The Mission Committee has supported Honduras Hope for many years. Meg Phillips has traveled with them as a volunteer multiple times and has seen first hand the power of working together.



The Pease Greeter program is on hold until we learn more about the future of it. A number of knitted hats and beautiful red, white and blue Christmas stockings that were completed already, were dropped off. Homes will be found for those items, possibly with the local Coast Guard folks.

## Did you know....

The Charitable IRA Rollover, also known as a Qualified Charitable Disbursement (QED) allows Americans age 70 ½ and older to make gifts to one or more nonprofit organizations (such as Jackson Community Church) without federal tax penalty, by simply requesting a transfer of IRA assets from the plan administrator directly to your charities.

Gifts can be made up to \$100,000 annually and count towards the owner's Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for individuals age 72 and older. QCDs from pre-tax IRAs are still a tax-savvy giving strategy in 2021 if you are between age 70  $\frac{1}{2}$  and 72, even though RMDs are not required until age 72.

Consult your tax advisor for the best advice. This is a very painless and tax-advantaged way to support JCC and other favorite charities!





Have you considered naming Jackson Community Church in your estate plans?

Everyone has the capacity to leave a legacy – large or small – to the organizations that they care about most. There are many simple ways you can make a lasting gift to the church. JCC can be

named as a beneficiary in your will, IRA, or charitable trust. Charitable Gift Annuities are available through the United Church of Christ that will provide you with income for life, a tax deduction, and a substantial gift to the church in the future.
