Friends —

This December is filled with anxiety, anticipation and reflection. The past few months, we've provided daily meditations to help light your way in these times. As we approach Christmas, and look beyond it, let us pause. Catch our breath. Consider where we find ourselves as a community.

What if we reconsider what holiday means? Holi-days are holy days.

What if every day of this year has been a holy day? And every day we continue to wake up to breathe, live, work, worship, play, and learn together, becomes one more holy day? What if holy days were more than Sundays, Easter, and Christmas? What if we accept every day as holy? As sacred? As a gift?

If you think about the past year in this way, our faith community — and all those connected to us — have made every day holy. Though we are a small church, we are strong. Sustainable. Shining bright. This village church has been, with its share of bumps and bruises along the way, a faith community that has grown and thrived for the past twelve months.

We kept our doors open and unlocked, so that people could find a sanctuary. Developed ways to interact with the wider community. Strengthened civic partnerships for cultural and social justice initiatives such as concerts and Courageous Conversations. Put hopeful messages on sign boards. Established a lending library in the front of the church, so people could read and discuss books on current issues. Created ways for people to interact throughout the seasons: butterflies on the cross, prayers on the fence, painted pumpkins in the autumn, and most recently with Advent Christmas trees outside plus ornaments and Advent candle kits for families at home. Met for outdoor educational, social, and spiritual gatherings. Gathered virtually and in-person: creatively and safely. Made music as we learned new ways to sing together. Developed new study groups and supported other small-group gatherings who found homes on zoom or in the church.

This little church has marked life moments along the way. We continue to marry people. Memorialize people who have died. Waved good-bye to beloved friends who moved away. Prayed through personal and world crises. Welcomed new neighbors to the valley and also many people from different parts of the nation and world to join us virtually — via zoom — for conversation, learning, and worship.

We served others. Volunteered throughout the pandemic, working on several issues, such as homelessness, food insecurity, and racial justice. Tended to each other: carried meals and messages, care packages and cards. Worked at the polls. Conducted cautious visits and planned compassionate walks. Provided rides for medical appointments and errands. Offered grocery and newspaper drop-offs. Called each other to conduct wellness check-ins. Collaborated with other faith communities, nonprofit, and civic partners in the valley — and other parts of the world — on causes ranging from emergency food ministries to social justice concerns and shared religious observances.

Yes, we are changed. Yet we are here. And we didn't wait for Christmas to become a tenacious form of hope and healing for each other. We've done it every holy day of this difficult year.

Together we pause and imagine a different kind of Christmas. We have traditions and people that are out of reach this year. Plans that must change. Perhaps we can agree that many of us are exhausted and wrung-out. And yet, can we also say that we are feeling hopeful? Connected? Inspired?

Receive the gifts of this season. We have each other. And we are bound together by a Holy and transformative Love that will not be deterred by pandemic, disease, death, or our human imperfections. This Love is born again, into the world, and into our lives, in times like these.

We embody that Love for each other.

Let's stop and consider this realization. We embody Holy Love for each other. We've proven it in the past year! Look at the paragraphs above, and how this little church tells part of a larger sacred story. Love is tenacious and resilient, and finds a way to support and change us.

In November Honduras was hit hard with two back to back hurricanes. Hurricane Eta and Hurricane lota have devastated the areas of Plan Grande and San Jose, where Honduras Hope has been working to empower communities through health, education and self-sufficiency.

If you read the Honduras Hope winter <u>newsletter</u> you will see various testimonials on how the local people of this area were surviving during the Covid pandemic and how Honduras Hope was making a difference. After the back to back hurricanes many houses were destroyed, the water system is no longer functional, roads can not be crossed.... You can read about the hurricane updates here.

This years Annual Meeting will be held via Zoom. The link will be sent out as we get closer.


