One: Advent begins in darkness: darkness of the season and the darkness of our realities. O God, you have heard us confess, again and again, how our righteous dreams translate into real-world shortcoming.

People: First of all. prophets such as Isaiah wrote about how humanity repeatedly revealed its own imperfections.

One: We are always striving and falling, failing, or turning away from the choices and actions that would contribute to a just and merciful community for all of God's children.

People: Then Isaiah told us how God would respond by bringing advocates for peace, justice, and hope into the world.

God would choose us all over again, despite our mistakes.

One: We are the spiritual heirs to the people of Israel.

People: Now, just as in Isaiah's time, we turn away from the ideals embodied in promises made between God and God's people.

One: Sometimes we make lesser choices. We settle for more comfortable options. We compromise the world as God dared us to imagine it.

People: After the prophets, silence took over. Hundreds of years passed, and God did not seem to speak or act.

One: God's children felt abandoned. Sometimes we feel the same.

People: Yet we also acknowledge that Love walks and works in the world. We have felt it, seen it, and encountered it.

One: In this season, Love returns to us, even when we have stared into the night and the world's difficulties, and wondered if hope existed at all.

All: Today we admit that we give into the darkness too often. And we ask you to kindle the light within us. Remind us that we are heirs to light, to to love, to hope, to justice, to mercy, and to grace.
